

PARK AND RECREATION COMMISSION MEETING

CALL TO ORDER: Kennicker called the meeting to order at 4:40 p.m.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

MANAGER REPORTS – COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS:

Kennicker made the comment from citizens that they were extremely happy to have Miller Riverview Campground opened officially. Park Division Manager, Fehsal stated the campground was 95% full over July 4th weekend. Kennicker asked if the nearby golf courses changing policies would affect business. Recreation Division Manager felt confident that business will remain steady given our dedicated clientele. Kennicker made a comment to Manager Ware of feedback received for the Five Flags new mural. Manager Ware suggests the Arts and Cultural Affairs Coordinator and some of the artists to a meeting to educate the community and answer the questions some have regarding the mural. To receive factual background information. Tigges asked if the City Council will be working on priorities in the fall and if a wish list was necessary. Manager Ware stated that a request was not sent out to Commission, but she will ask Assistant City Manager, Cori Burbach for this information and will notify Commission the information.

COMMISSION COMMUNICATIONS/QUESTIONS:

Kennicker made note that she re-applied for the Park and Recreation Commission. Tigges asked if there was a City-wide policy regarding masks. Manager Ware mentioned that City staff are supposed to be the best ambassadors of all the safety requirements but at times this is not always followed. Guidance has been issued but not set policy City-wide to follow but staff have created re-entry plans for the safest environment possible.
